New Catechetical Certification Process

As indicated in the December Update, we have introduced a new catechetical certification process that is offered through the online platform, My Catholic Faith Delivered. The Office of Catholic Schools requires all full-time and part-time teachers, Catholic and non-Catholic, to seek Level I Catechetical Certification, which involves a series of online courses and retreat focused on spiritual, theological and ministerial formation.
