Fr. Kiiiguta was born and raised in Bukoba, Tanzania. He is the sixth of eleven children from a strong Catholic family. As a young child, he was an altar server and choir member. As a sixth grader, he joined the minor seminary and went on to a high school seminary. He went on to study at Consolata Institute of Philosophy in Nairobi, Kenya.

In August 2000, he joined the Archdiocese of Chicago and spent one year at Tuite House located at St. Columbanus. He studied at University of St. Mary of Lake/Mundelein Seminary where he founded an African choir. He was ordained on May 20, 2006. He served as an associate pastor at Sacred Heart in Winnetka for almost five years before becoming pastor to St. John de la Salle Parish.

A Binding Commitment Professional Development Program

The Office of Catholic Schools in partnership with the Anti-Defamation League invites all pastors, DREs, principals, and teachers of grades 6-12 to participate in our annual professional development program – *A Binding Commitment* – a two-day opportunity, Friday, August 4 and Monday, August 7, to explore the history of Catholic Christian relations with our Jewish brothers and sisters. The two-day event includes the following:

- an overview of Catholic teaching regarding ecumenical dialogue and religious pluralism;
- a brief history of anti-Semitism;
- an experience of a Shabbat service on Lake Michigan at North Shore Congregation Israel;
- dinner with a Holocaust survivor;
- a full-day visit to the Illinois Holocaust Museum and Education Center where participants learn about a Holocaust and modern-day genocide curriculum entitled, *Echoes and Reflection*.

This life-changing and pedagogically enhancing professional development program is applicable to all academic disciplines, especially religion, social studies, and history. Previous participants continue to attest to the transformative nature of this two-day professional development experience on both a personal and collective level. Teacher Evaluation Pilot Cohort FY18

Principals who have successfully completed the Danielson training (earning a rating of "Proficient") are invited to participate in the pilot of the revised teacher evaluation process during the 2017/18 school year. **Principals are asked to complete the following application form for the pilot:** <http://bit.ly/2r0qzLz> Deadline for the application is Friday, June 2.

Principals who want to participate in the pilot have an opportunity to complete the training this summer. OCS is encouraging principals of schools involved in Turnaround and PIP (Parish Improvement Program) efforts to participate in the FY18 Danielson cohort. Notification of acceptance into the pilot will be communicated to applicants no later than Tuesday, June 6. Mandatory implementation training will be held on August 2 (Quigley Pastoral Center) or August 8 (Meyer Center). Principals attend one session. This training session will be approximately 3-4 hours. Participation in the pilot requires all observations/evaluations of teacher performance to be completed using the Danielson Framework for Teaching and the revised AoC teacher evaluation instrument and process. The Teacher Evaluation Committee is completing final revisions to the teacher evaluation instrument based on feedback from the May 4 Leadership Day and the Curriculum Advisory Committee. Revisions will be finalized and communicated to those who want to participate in the pilot by Monday, June 12.
