We are excited to announce that the Office of Catholic Schools, in partnership with Our Sunday Visitor (OSV), is hosting workshops for Catholic grade school teachers focused on “Divine Pedagogy” with Dr. Joseph White on Thursday, August 10 at Cardinal Joseph Bernardin School in Orland Hills and Monday, August 14 at St. Thomas of Villanova School in Palatine. Dr. Joseph White, a child psychologist and OSV National Catechetical Consultant, will provide a practical approach to “Divine Pedagogy,” ultimately focusing on a teacher’s ability to teach and form faith in innovative and relevant ways. During the afternoon, we will invite teachers from the participating schools to engage in grade level collaboration around religious instruction and faith formation, as well as, weaving Catholic Identity across the academic curriculum. The day will run from approximately 8:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. The registration fee for the workshop is \$15 per person and it will cover the cost of a light breakfast and lunch. 2017 ACT Aspire Scores

Final results of the ACT Aspire summative test for Archdiocesan students in grades 3-8 will be available on the ACT Aspire portal on Wednesday, June 28. Principals have access to this portal. The Office of Catholic Schools is supporting the communication of 2017 ACT Aspire results with the following resources:

1. A letter to the parents of recent 8th grade graduates that can be customized for your school explaining the test results. This letter should be mailed to parents with their students 2017 test results. This letter will be sent to all elementary principals electronically on Friday, June 30.
2. A letter to the parents of rising 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade students that can be sent out with students’ 2017 ACT Aspire results. Principals are urged to wait to send out 2017 ACT Aspire results until after the August 3 Leadership Day where system-wide results and analysis will be shared.
3. Workshops will be provided in August (please see dates below) to all Archdiocesan principals and teachers who provide support for the interpretation of 2017 ACT Aspire results and the creation of your school’s Continuous School Improvement Plan (CSIP) for the 2017/2018 school year.
 - Workshop Title: Understanding and Using the ACT Aspire Spring 2017 Results, 8:30 to 11:30 a.m.
 - Workshop Title: Create the 2017-18 Continuous School Improvement Plan, 12:30 to 3:30 pm. Workshop dates are Tuesday, August 8; Wednesday, August 9; Thursday, August 10; Tuesday, August 15; Wednesday, August 16; Thursday, August 17; and Friday, August 18.

Additionally, OCS encourages principals to share 2017 ACT Aspire results with their pastors and School Boards in advance of communications sent home regarding student’s 2017 ACT Aspire performance. In addition to the discussion of this important information with key stakeholders, OCS would like schools to post their 2017 ACT Aspire results on their school’s website.
