The times may have changed, but the philosophy upon which St. Benedict Prep was founded endures.


At St. Benedict Preparatory School (SBPS) we:

# An Innovative Approach to Curriculum

At St. Benedict Preparatory School (SBPS) we focus on traditional core subjects, faith formation, and enrichment. By utilizing the most current educational philosophies and the latest technologies, we ensure that every student has the opportunity to learn and grow. This approach gives every student the chance to excel – regardless of the learner's level.

Having preschool through 12th grade within the same system is one the many advantages of a SBPS education. This unique approach provides an invaluable opportunity to build upon mastery of standards from one year to the next. This continuity and community building with our students helps to build a solid foundation for educational growth.

## Early Childhood: Preschool and Kindergarten



During these formative years, we focus on developmentally appropriate activities for our young students. In Preschool, a nurturing and fun environment allows for not only supervised play, but content-based learning integral to the development of pre-literacy and pre-math skills. Kindergarten literacy and math skills are built upon using Everyday Math and Reading Mastery. Everyday Math teaches application of math skills in real world situations. Reading Mastery develops a strong phonics foundation and allows

students to begin reading at their own level. Center-based activities allow hands-on experiences for students to learn at their own pace. This type of learning fosters the development of social, fine, and gross motor skills.

## Primary Grades: 1st and 2nd



In the primary grades, preschool pre-literacy and pre-math skills are built upon. Everyday Math, a comprehensive math curriculum developed by the University of Chicago, teaches application of math skills in real world situations. Students learn through hands-on activities, games, real-life problem solving, school-family cooperation, and appropriate use of technology. Guided Reading in first and second grades develops reading strategies and literacy skills with an emphasis on decoding, fluency, and

comprehension. Through teacher support, students develop the skills to become independent readers. Language Arts, Religion, Science, and Social Studies complete the curriculum focus.

## Intermediate Grades: 3rd, 4th, and 5th



Everyday Math continues in the intermediate grades, as students continue to learn the underlying principles of math and how to apply them. The Guided Reading curriculum remains a critical component of learning as students begin reading at personalized levels. In addition, Reader's Workshop allows students to write about their reading and receive individual feedback from their teacher. In Language Arts, students use critical thinking, grammar skills, and the writing process to create various types of writing pieces. Religion,


Science, and Social Studies curriculum allows students to study individual topics more in-depth. Research and presentation skills are developed through special projects and assignments.

## Middle School Grades: 6th, 7th, and 8th



Technology is a key tool used in meeting the needs of Middle School (MS) students. MS students use laptop or tablet computers and core curriculum subjects are integrated through the use of this Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program. Students working on a science fair project can create graphs in Math, write a research paper in English, and develop scientific theories in Science and Social Studies. Reading and Writing skills are integrated through novel and literature study. Students who

excel in Math and English can enroll in high school level courses at St. Benedict College Prep High School. In addition, middle school students are offered high school level electives in Art, Spanish, Mandarin, Drama, and Chorus.



## Assessments

## Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Assessment

St. Benedict Preparatory School (SBPS) administers the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Assessment created by the Northwest Evaluation Association. Assessments in reading, language usage, and math reveal precisely which academic skills and concepts a student has acquired and what they are ready to learn. MAP assessments compare and predict student achievement and growth over time.

The computer- based assessment creates a personalized experience by adapting to individual students instructional level. This means that the assessment becomes more difficult the more questions students answer correctly. When students answer a question incorrectly, the computerized assessment adjusts to the level of difficulty. In this way, students create an assessment specifically for his or her learning level.

#### MAP assessment results are used:

- by teachers to personalize instruction to maximize every student's academic growth.
- by administration to track the achievement and growth of every student and classroom.
- by teachers and administration to evaluate the success of programs and curriculum.

All students in 1st through 12th grade are administered the MAP assessment 2-3 times per year. Kindergarten students are administered the MAP assessment 2 times per year. Assessments will not be used to determine overall student performance. It is expected that there will be areas of development, readiness, and reinforcement. The results do not depict mastery or suggest appropriate grade-level proficiency.

#### Portfolio Assessment

Portfolio Assessment is used in the preschool and elementary school as another tool in student assessment. It is a collection of student's work that shows growth and mastery toward grade level standards. Students and teachers have the opportunity to document, review, analyze, and reflect upon content learning. Student involvement in portfolio development enhances the learning process and allows students to become more involved in their own learning.

**ACT** Aspire

Students in grades 3-10 are administered the ACT Aspire standardized assessment. The Aspire test is aligned with new Archdiocese of Chicago curriculum standards and is designed to provide insights into the effectiveness of curriculum and student achievement. Students complete tests in 5 key areas: English, Math, Reading, Science, and Writing.
